Save time ➤ They receive the ACTION of the verb ➤ MAINLY THINGS. (LO/LA;LOS LAS) ➤ SOMETIMES PEOPLE(ME,TE,NOS,OS) ➤ PLACED IN A SENTENCE: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 1 VERB(conjugated): BEFORE IT <u>Compro un chigua-gua</u> Lo compro(Lo=un chigua-gua) ○ 2 VERBS: 1 conjugated+1 infinitive *BEFORE conjugated verb *ATTACHED to the infinitive verb <u>Voy a comprar un chigua-gua</u> *Lo voy a comprar *Voy a comprarlo 	

INDIRECT AND DIRECT OBJECT PRONOUNS TOGETHER IN A PARTY.

Sometimes both hang out together, and when it happens the rules change a little bit

- PLACING THEM IN A SENTENCE: **PEOPLE FIRST** (The indirect object pronouns will be placed first before the direct object pronouns)

1 VERB: BOTH BEFORE THE CONJUGATED VERB

- Compro un chigua-gua a mí
Me lo compro (Me=a mí ; Lo: chigua-gua)

2 VERBS:

- BOTH BEFORE the conjugated verb (Remember people (I.O.P) first)
 - Voy a comprar **un chigua-gua para mí**
Me lo voy a comprar
- BOTH ATTACHED TO THE INFINITIVE (Remember people (I.O.P) first)
 - Voy a comprar **un chiguagua para mí**
Voy a comprarmelo

- When the indirect object pronouns **LE/LES** (third person) go to a party with the direct object pronouns: **LO/LA/LOS/LAS** (third person) **LE/LES** dance so much than twist and turn to **SE**

LE/LES+LO/LA/LOS/LAS= SE+LO/LA/LOS/LAS

1 VERB: BOTH BEFORE THE CONJUGATED VERB

- Compro un chigua-gua a mi amiga Ana
Le lo compro INCORRECT
Se lo compro. CORRECT (Se=is Le, a mi amiga ; Lo: chigua-gua)

2 VERBS:

- BOTH BEFORE the conjugated verb (Remember people (I.O.P) first)
 - Voy a comprar un **chigua-gua a mi amiga Ana**
Se lo voy a comprar
- BOTH ATTACHED TO THE INFINITIVE (Remember people (I.O.P) first)
 - Voy a comprar un chiguagua a mi amiga Ana
Voy a comprárselo
